Re FD-71 Complaint Form dated 6/24/68 of SA [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who resides at [REDACTED] California, advised on 7/1/68 that he had in his possession several books which he had obtained in a backyard sale of various items at the house located [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that he had no reason to believe that these books had anything at all to do with SIRHAN SIRHAN or no member of his family, except for the fact that two or three weeks ago, or sometime after the assassination of Senator KENNEDY, inquiry had been made in that neighborhood by law enforcement officers concerning the fact that SIRHAN SIRHAN's brother had once resided in that area. He stated that based upon this prior inquiry concerning SIRHAN's brother and because these books he obtained were all "liberal in nature," he felt that it was something worth notifying the FBI.

He stated he did not know SIRHAN SIRHAN or his family and he had no reason to believe that these books had ever belonged to any of them. He stated that several of the books had a stamp on the inside cover indicating that they were from the library of [REDACTED] who used to reside [REDACTED].

With all respect I'm addressing myself to you to tell you the following. With all my heart's sincerity, I send my condolences to President L.B. Johnson and to the widow of Honorable Robert F. Kennedy, who died serving his nation.

Here I'm sending you the names of two persons that I told that they have to kill another important person in order that three are completed, beginning with President Kennedy, they are witnesses that I told before it happened:

I didn't tell the Government because there are persons who laugh because they don't know God, and their purpose is to kill.

Let's see if you believe in what I say to you, then you can believe what I say right away. That the policy which you have placed on the Americans is mature [?] and divided. Because of that they take advantage of this to kill those who can defend the Nation and now [they? you? verb used can mean either] are up a blind alley.

SIRHAN SIRHAN reportedly employed as a horse exercise boy, Corona, California, area 1965-66. Employment with Granja Vista Del Rio Thoroughbred Horse Farm at Corona, owned by BERT ALTFILISCH, confirmed.

Possibility SIRHAN may have exercised horses for DESI ARNAZ, TV actor-producer and owner of Corona Breeding Farm at Corona, California. ARNAZ has advised secretaries in Hollywood, California, [redacted] and [redacted] at General Service Studios, that he has no personal recollection of SIRHAN and has a very limited contact with employees at the breeding farm. ARNAZ suggested that his horse trainer, [redacted] and his ranch manager, [redacted] and his business manager and accountant [redacted] Corona, who has payroll, be contacted.

San Diego at Del Mar, California, will contact DESI ARNAZ, [redacted] phone [redacted] show photographs of SIRHAN and ascertain any knowledge ARNAZ may have of SIRHAN.

On 7/5/68, Supervisor [REDACTED] of the San Francisco Office of the FBI advised that they had been unable to contact [REDACTED] for interview as he had failed to keep any of the appointments that he and/or his attorney [REDACTED] had made with that office.

[REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] at whose ranch [REDACTED] had previously been staying, had called the San Francisco Office on the morning of 7/5/68 and indicated that [REDACTED] would probably stay in the Northern California area as he apparently did not want to be far removed from his attorney [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that Attorney [REDACTED] was out of town and would call the FBI, San Francisco, on Monday morning next to arrange for [REDACTED] to be interviewed in the office of attorney [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] had been served with an order by the Los Angeles police officers who interviewed him that he should not discuss this case publically.

[REDACTED] advised that he did not feel that it was advisable to conduct an interview with [REDACTED] in the presence of his attorney [REDACTED] office.

A review of LAPD records concerning this case reflects that ETHEL CREHAN of [REDACTED] California, telephone numbers [REDACTED] on 6/7/68, contacted the LAPD and advised that she had worked in the KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters in Azusa, California.

This woman advised on 5/30/68, three persons had entered the campaign headquarters and asked if KENNEDY would be in Azusa. Mrs. CREHAN allegedly identified a photograph of SIRHAN B. SIRHAN as being one of the individuals who had made inquiry.

She obtained one job which she held for 2 days and then quit informing [redacted] that her employers [redacted].

[redacted] has been acting in a rather strange fashion since coming to [redacted]. She has difficulty sleeping and will not retire without [redacted]. [redacted] stated that [redacted] will not leave the home [redacted].

On Saturday, June 8, 1966, the day of ROBERT KENNEDY's funeral, [REDACTED] watched the funeral on television and was particularly moved by the eulogy given by Senator KENNEDY at the funeral service. Some time during the morning he saw [REDACTED] in the street outside [REDACTED] and they began talking about politics. The shooting of ROBERT KENNEDY came up. At that time [REDACTED] made some strange remarks which [REDACTED] thought should be reported. [REDACTED] it was too bad that BOBBY KENNEDY had been shot, and that he had just seen EDWARD KENNEDY on television, and that EDWARD KENNEDY probably now would run for the Presidency. [REDACTED] said, "When we don't like them in California, we kill them," and then mentioning Senator EDWARD KENNEDY, said, "We'll kill that son of a bitch, too, if he runs."

[REDACTED] mentioned that he had been in the Watts Area at the time of the riots, and that they all had guns ready to go in case the Negroes came into their area, but the police told them to hold off.

At various times during the past several months he has seen [REDACTED] walking around the streets of [REDACTED] with handguns in his hip pockets. One of the guns is a German luger while the other is a .38 caliber Smith and Wesson [REDACTED] did not have any guns with him on the morning of June 8 when they were talking about the KENNEDYs. He has not seen the guns recently.

He knows of no criminal activities of [REDACTED] or that he has any criminal or undesirable associates. He knows of no organizations that [REDACTED] belongs to, although [REDACTED] once said she belonged to the John Birch Society.

[REDACTED] go camping quite frequently for several days at a time. They go by themselves.

He has no knowledge that [REDACTED] was in the Los Angeles area at the time ROBERT KENNEDY was shot, and no information to indicate that he had any connection with that shooting.

[REDACTED] does not drink except on occasion, but he does not believe [REDACTED] was drinking on the morning of June 8, 1968.

No Love For LBJ

You will hear some of these accusations as soon as 1968!

Just who are Robert Kennedy's enemies?

There is certainly no love lost between Bobby and President Johnson, who has already—in veiled form—blasted Kennedy's stand on "snooping and bugging" devices. However, though Johnson may be Bobby's greatest enemy, he is the last man in the world who would commit such an act. The President is a moral man who fights his battles in the political arena!

But there are others who don't.

While there may have been a foreign influence in the death of President Kennedy, the chances are high, however, that the death of Robert Kennedy will be a national affair—perpetrated by American killers!

Bitter Foes

The Insider, in a far-reaching investigation, sought to pinpoint the most bitter enemies of Robert Kennedy. The two best-known enemies of the young senator are James Hoffa and the Cosa Nostra. It is unlikely, though, that Hoffa himself would go as far as to order

"What I'm afraid will happen is that some wise guy will kidnap one of the Kennedy children—as a beginning. They'll hit as close as they can to this man!

"The Mafia or a labor union most likely will be behind it—although the rank-and-file union member won't know a thing about it. The average union member doesn't have anything against Kennedy. It's the bosses—the ones who get their toes stepped on.

"Whether Bobby was right or not, I'm not in a position to say. As an agent, I can't say much about what's going on between the Mafia and the labor unions.

"Both groups have some pretty high officials on their death list. Officially, of course, I can't name names. I can't say Bobby Kennedy is or is not a target. That's something you'll just have to guess at."

'Spoiled Brat'

The Insider turned to jailed Teamster boss James Hoffa for a look at what the short labor wizard thinks of his greatest adversary:

"Now, I regard Bobby Kennedy as a spoiled brat! He's just a brat that believes everybody is supposed to surrender and give in to whatever he wants, right or wrong. In my opinion, he prostitutes his oath of office, and he's violated the Constitution of the United States and is subject to go to jail.

"I question whether or not he has a single friend, and I question whether or not his associates are other than people who

permanently use the one he could use, and the greatest public relations campaign in the world, to try to distort, deceive, and destroy James Hoffa."

As friends of Hoffa will tell you, when someone tries to destroy James Hoffa, Hoffa retaliates "with vigah" and closely follows the rule of "survival of the fittest." Whether Robert Kennedy will be the one to survive is very doubtful.

A close friend of the Kennedy family revealed that there have been hundreds of hate letters sent to the Kennedy home and office.

'Serious Threat'

"Bobby doesn't take many of them seriously. They're just the usual assortment of cranks and crackpots.

"But once in a while he runs across one that has to be a really serious threat. Sometimes the writer mentions certain plans or something of that nature pertaining to an upcoming trip—something only the Kennedys were supposed to have known.

"Someone hates Bobby with a passion! He knows it. He never lets Ethel see the letters. But I think she knows. Whoever it is that wants him dead has powerful contacts up on the Hill (Capitol Hill). Someday I'm afraid they'll succeed."

The weak spot of the Kennedy clan is their utmost trust in others.

It was a Thursday evening when Jack Kennedy said he did not want a top on the motorcade convertible. Yes, he said, he knew Dallas had spat upon Adlai Stevenson only a few weeks before. Yes, he had seen

assassination—grinning childishly as he brandished a make-believe machine gun!

But John Kennedy belonged to the people. And the people belonged to him. They were one and the same.

Part Of People

Less than 24 hours later John F. Kennedy was dead.

Prior to November 22, Bobby Kennedy had been much the same way when it came to pleasing the public. Today that ardor has dampened only slightly. Bobby still likes the crowds, the cheers, and the noise. He is a part of the people. And the people are a part of him.

The dignity of the Kennedy heart was recently demonstrated by Ethel when she was taken to court for "stealing" a horse. The owner, Nicholas Zema, told a jury of seven men that the horse was valued at \$10,000 because of the racing blood in his ancestry.

Ethel Kennedy told the same jury she found this so-called "prize race horse" starving and uncared-for and took it home to feed it. Five days later it died—of starvation.

White House Out!

When jurors heard that ancestors of Pando, the dead horse, "had never won a race," the case was dismissed.

This is the Kennedy heart. Someday soon, for Robert F. Kennedy, that heart will stop beating. Robert Kennedy will never live to see the White House!

er will have a much more profound effect upon her than did the assassination of the President upon Jackie Kennedy.

Jacqueline's pose—if we are to believe her statements in Wil Ham Manchester's "Death of a President"—was an act of anger. She "wanted the world to see what they had done to Jack."

Ethel has little of Jackie's queenliness; Ethel could be just another housewife in Smalltown, U.S.A. She has none of Jacqueline's reserve, none of the timidity. Ethel is closer to the people than Jackie ever was. This will cause her the pain—the fact that the people Ethel Kennedy was so much a part of would be responsible for murdering her husband.

Lonely Sorrow

While widow Jacqueline has only Caroline and John-John to consider, Ethel will have nine fatherless children to clothe, feed, and love.

The sorrow of the exquisite and beautiful Jacqueline Kennedy were shared by a grieving nation. The sorrow of equally beautiful Ethel Kennedy will be borne alone.

This story is one the Insider takes little pleasure in presenting. But nonetheless, we have good reason to believe that the young New York senator with the Boston accent and the Harvard haircut will soon be given his own resting place in Arlington National Cemetery.

He will go down in history as the second Kennedy in public office to die at the hands of a assassin's bullet.

As you will recall, Special Agent [REDACTED] of this Bureau recently discussed with you one Crispin Curiel Gonzalez, an individual formerly under the supervision of your agency.

For the completion of your files, the following information is being made available:

b7D On July 1, 1968, [REDACTED] advised Special Agents of the El Paso Division of the FBI that Gonzalez had been found to be psychotic. On receipt of instructions from Mexico City, Gonzalez had been interned at the General Hospital for the Insane in Juarez, Mexico.

According to [REDACTED] Gonzalez admitted to him that the story he presumably related to the press, administration officials, and police officers was a hoax. He also criticized those responsible for being so gullible as to believe such a fantastic story.

On July 5, 1968, [REDACTED] advised Special Agents of the FBI that Gonzalez was discovered dead in his solitary confinement quarters at the General Hospital for the



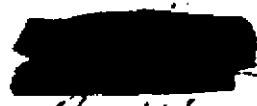

Referenced teletype reflects that at the outset of the interview of [REDACTED] advised that upon the conclusion of his interview by Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) Officers at San Francisco on 7/3/68, he informed them that he was to see representatives of the FBI, and they stated they would rather he did not talk to the FBI but could not stop him if he desired to do so.

As the Bureau is aware, there is currently in force a court order issued by the Superior Court at Los Angeles in connection with this matter prohibiting witnesses and potential witnesses, police and attorneys, from discussing this matter other than with legitimate investigative personnel. The extent of this order is such that a copy was served upon the Mayor of Los Angeles, SAMUEL W. YORTY, in order to preclude the Mayor from making any statements regarding SIRHAN B. SIRHAN.

[REDACTED] advised that Curriel had been found to be psychotic and on receipt of specific instructions from Mexico City, Curriel had been interned at the General Hospital for the Insane, Juarez, Mexico. [REDACTED] had made a recommendation that Curriel be sent to another institution more adequately equipped to handle juveniles, and he was advised that any decision in this regard would necessarily have to be made by the administrator of the hospital.

[REDACTED] Curriel, on realizing what he had done by attracting so much attention to himself, openly admitted the entire story was a hoax, and he readily criticized newspaper reporters, administration officials, and police officers for being so gullible as to believe this fantastic story.

On July 5, 1968, [REDACTED] Curriel, while in solitary confinement at the General Hospital for the Insane, had put together a rope from the mattress material located in his room and he hung himself. He was discovered dead at approximately 7:45 p.m. on the evening of July 4, 1968, by an attendant of the hospital.

Shortly thereafter, an usher told the two men to move and they went to one side and stood alongside two women. During this time, Senator WONG from Hawaii was speaking, but the two men were concentrating on someone else seated on the Senate floor.

The unknown complainant further stated he saw SIRHAN SIRHAN's brother on television recently and is fairly positive the two men mentioned above were SIRHAN SIRHAN and his brother.

GONZALEZ first came to the attention following his arrest by the Los Angeles Police Department on October 24, 1967. At that time he was taken into custody by the Los Angeles Police Department in the vicinity of Zonal and Mission Road in Los Angeles and charged with violation of Section 601 of the Welfare and Institutions Code (transient). According to the police report he was found wandering without a settled place of abode, no visible means of existence or proper guardianship within the Los Angeles jurisdiction. Upon questioning by arresting officers, he was found to be dirty and his clothes wrinkled and told officers he did not know the whereabouts of his parents; had no money; had no way to support himself and had not eaten in two days. When questioned by investigators he made conflicting and "inconsistent" statements. He was evasive and refused to answer some questions. At first he stated he was from Bolivia, South America having left there about three weeks prior to his arrest. He later stated he was from Colima, Mexico. He stated his parents came to Los Angeles leaving him at home and he stole 800 pesos from them and came to Los Angeles. He claimed not to know where his parents were and that he had an uncle living in Los Angeles. He furnished the name of and a telephone number 754-7202, which number proved to be nonexistent and no one by the name was located. Since there was no known person to whom he could be referred, protective custody

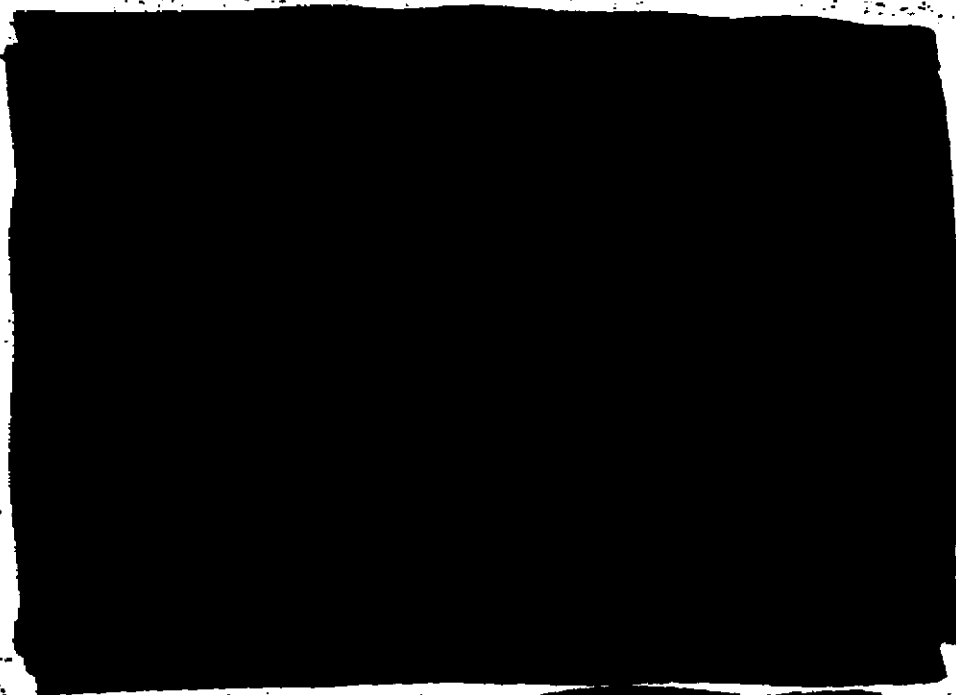

on December 8, 1967 a telegraph was sent to the parents of GONIALEZ requesting them to sign a notarized letter permitting him to travel and a copy of his birth certificate. No reply was received to that request. GONIALEZ was then placed for residence at Boys Oasis, 40892 Harper Lake, Hinkley, California on January 18, 1968. This is a privately operated residence authorized by the Juvenile Court to accept juveniles for residence and Los Angeles County pays for their expenses. He remained there until January 22, 1968 when he ran away and was picked up by the San Bernardino Police Department on that same date as a runaway juvenile. He was returned to the custody of the Los Angeles County Juvenile Hall where he remained until Janua

where he remained until March 22, 1968, when he was permitted to take up residence at the above mentioned MPR. On March 29, 1968 he ran away from the MPR and on April 1, 1968 voluntarily surrendered himself to the custody of Juvenile Authorities. On May 21, 1968 he again ran away from his residence at MPR; his whereabouts since that time until June 17, 1968 were unknown and a warrant has been issued for his arrest as a runaway juvenile.

b7D On June 17, 1968 at approximately 10:30 a.m. [redacted] received a collect telephone call from GONZALEZ from El Paso, Texas. At that time GONZALEZ desired to know what would happen to him if he should return to Los Angeles, California. [redacted] advised GONZALEZ that a warrant was outstanding for his arrest charging him with being a runaway juvenile and that he would be returned to the custody of the Juvenile Court and probably referred to the California Youth Authority (CYA). During the telephone conversation GONZALEZ advised [redacted] he was involved in international narcotics smuggling between El Paso, Texas and Mexico. He furnished as a Los Angeles "connection", a restaurant called the Mexico Lindo, 2829 Washington Street, Venice, California. [redacted] has not attempted to verify the foregoing but did report it to a [redacted] Los Angeles Police Department, Narcotics Detail. In the telephone conversation GONZALEZ also advised [redacted] would show up in Los Angeles within six hours from the time of the telephone call. [redacted] has received no further contact from or in behalf of GONZALEZ since that telephone call.

During the period of time he was a resident at the MPR, he attempted, on two occasions in May, 1968, to commit suicide by cutting his wrists. One of those occasions resulted in his hospitalization at the Los Angeles County General Hospital on or about May 8, 1968. He attempted another subsequent suicide by cutting his wrists sometime between May 14 and 22, 1968. On that occasion he leaped onto the roof of a nearby building threatening suicide and considerably upsetting other members of the MPR.

[REDACTED] stated that although he is 16 years of age, GONZALEZ acts like a 13 year old; is considerably very immature for his chronological age and will do anything to get attention.

There is no indication in his file that he has associated or was acquainted with anyone by the name of SIRHAN. [REDACTED] while residing at the MPR he was not considered reliable and frequently engaged in the conduct and/or activities which could be characterized as fantasy. He is further described as a white male, born November 10, 1951, weighing 119 pounds, is 5'7" tall and has dark wavy hair. There is no indication in the file of any known associates of his in the Los Angeles area.

There was another young man sitting next to him, however, she did not know if these two men were together. [redacted] described the young man in question as possibly identical with SIRHAN SIRHAN. She noted the man wore tennis shoes and blue jeans. [redacted] said that this man appeared to possibly be identical with the KENNEDY assassin whose picture she has observed on her TV which gives a relatively dark picture.

b7D [REDACTED] advised that at approximately 8:20 p.m. on June 6, 1968 she received a call from an unknown male who advised he was calling from Muncie, Indiana. The caller asked if the assassin of KENNEDY was being held in San Francisco and she told him that he was not. The caller then stated "It's a good thing he isn't and in fact whoever has him should guard him closely as I intend to kill him." The operator transferred the call to one of the police department inspectors and he talked to the man for only a few seconds before he hung up. Apparently he made this same threat to the police department inspector. An attempt was made by the police department to trace the call through the Muncie, Indiana operator which was unsuccessful since the caller had hung up. It was determined through the operator that when the man placed the call he had given a non-existent telephone number as the number he was calling from.

MICHAEL SLOMICH was contacted at [REDACTED] San Mateo, California, during the evening of June 5, 1968. He was interviewed in the presence of [REDACTED]. He stated that he is at present [REDACTED] San Francisco, and resides at [REDACTED] Street, San Francisco, California.

MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he attended Pasadena City College approximately one and a half years and subsequently attended University of California at Los Angeles from approximately February, 1966, to December, 1967, at which time he graduated.

MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he is aware that there is a Syrian-Lebanese Cultural Center, possibly known as the Syrian-Lebanese-American Cultural Center, located on Hollywood Boulevard near Sunset Strip. He stated that this group is a far right group, and he has knowledge that in the past the organization has permitted the American Nazi Party to utilize their headquarters to hold meetings and conduct action against "peace" demonstrators and to "eliminate traitors." These meetings occurred in approximately August 1967. ✓

SLOMICH stated that he may have seen SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN at some of these meetings or in connection with this group. SLOMICH said he is not positive at all that he has seen SIRHAN and states he has no acquaintance with him.

SLOMICH further advised that in Pasadena, California, on Colorado Boulevard, across the street from Pasadena City College, a bookstore known as the Americanism Book Store was formerly located. This store is now out of existence and has been gone for approximately two years. MICHAEL SLOMICH stated this book store was operated by a former Navy Petty officer whose name he does not recall, and it is his impression that in its stock it carried the far right Arab literature which was strongly anti-Semitic. He stated that he felt this could

Further interview with MICHAEL SLOMICH elicited from him the fact that he attended DuBois Club meetings at the University of California at Los Angeles from approximately February, 1966, to December, 1967.

[REDACTED] SLOMICH stated that in his association with the DuBois Club, which also included three city-wide meetings and twelve city-wide parties, he had never observed SIRHAN at any of these affairs. He indicated that he considered the DuBois Club to be a conservative-type organization composed of middle-class students who were rebelling against their parents. It was a non-militant, nonactive group interested principally in theory. He advised that the DuBois Club at Pasadena City College was never active to any extent.

In addition, MICHAEL SLOMICH stated that he was in the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) at the University of California at Los Angeles from February, 1966, to December, 1967, and attended many meetings of this organization. He expressed the opinion that he knew everyone in the SDS in Southern California, including students from University of California at Los Angeles, Pasadena City College, Los Angeles City College and University of Southern California. He stated that he does not recall SIRHAN as ever being in attendance at any of these meetings, nor was he known to him in any way through these activities.

SLOMICH advised that he is presently active in the SDS at San Francisco State College and has been one of the activists protesting the Naval ROTC unit on the campus, and that he has been involved in the current demonstrations at this school.

[REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] age [REDACTED] a U. S. Army veteran who resides at the 18 peso (\$1.44 U.S.) a day Lisboa Hotel, had caused him trouble in the past, and he wanted to "report him." [REDACTED] lady friend, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] Zapopan, Jalisco, was identified by [REDACTED] as a former resident of Germany, with whom [REDACTED] had spoken of opening a hotel at Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco.

[REDACTED] was assured that his letter would be kept confidential.

[REDACTED] of the American Consulate General at Guadalajara, Jalisco, on June 26, 1968, stated that [REDACTED] receives a Social Security check at the Consulate. He advised that inasmuch as [REDACTED] is not old enough to receive a retirement check he apparently receives a check for health reasons, possibly mental.

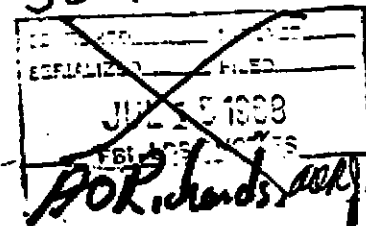

Sandra Mettetal by phone was questioned for details about above group, 7-3-68. She said she did not know if the group of singers she had previously mentioned was an organized group. They were kids hanging around the area where Sen. Kennedy was scheduled to speak in the Embassy room at the Ambassador Hotel, 6-4-68 pm. The group came up to Sandra and asked her if it was ok for them to get up on the podium and sing. She informed the group, 2 white males, 1 white female and 1 male negro, they would have to get permission from some one in Kennedy campaign party. She later saw the group talking to Karen Kline of the Kennedy Campaign staff. Kline is still working at the Kennedy campaign office 5615 Wilshire Bl., L. A. which is now devoted to gun control campaign.

Kline by phone 7-3-68 said she recalled the group of singers dressed in orange and white and described by Sandra above. The group did not appear to be organized or have a name and in her opinion was a pick up group from kids who hang around rallies seeking to capitalize on them. The group had ask her her if it was alright to get up on the podium and sing and they were informed they could not do this but no objection was voiced to them standing on the floor in front fo the podium and singing. Kline did not know any of the group or where they were from, their name or any thing about them. She had no knowledge of this group singing frequently at Kennedy rallies.

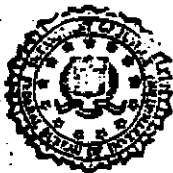

Sandra was phoned 7-3-68 for detail. She said the above employee drove a large white auto with "Continental Recordings" in blue letters on each side. He had a press pass. She saw him with recording equipment on the podium during Kennedy's speech 6-4-68 at the hotel. She later saw him during the Sirhan hearing in the press area.

A.M. Mazzone, Public Affairs, LAPD, 7-3-68, said press pass indices of his dept. revealed a let. 8-17-67 requesting press passes for Carlton Werner, DOB [REDACTED] and Lew Werner age [REDACTED]. They claimed to represent Continental Recordings who did work for Sta. KPOL, 15700 Sunset Bl. #466-4123-phone listing Mr. Brent, News Div. They listed a box # 5539, Sherman Oaks, Cal. as a mail add.

Bob Scott, program director, KPOL, 7-8-68 said Jeff Brent # 784-5488 was the Continental Recording employee who had covered the Kennedy party, 6-4-68.

[REDACTED], Continental Recordings, Div. of Continental News, 15300 Ventura Bl., Sherman Oaks, Cal., room 211, phone 784-5488, 7-9-68, said Jeff Brent and Ira Goldstein were only employees who had covered the Kennedy party at the Ambassador, 6-4/5-68. Ira was involved and of course been interviewed by FBI and Brent had not been interviewed by FBI as far as [REDACTED] knew.

Brent phoned Agent [REDACTED] 7-9-68 said he was working in the same area with Sandy of City News Service at the Kennedy party at the Ambassador 6-4-68 but did not witness the actual shooting nor did he see Sirhan himself at any time. He had a friend, Ted Charach [REDACTED] who said had pictures of persons thought to be Sirhan and the girl in the pokedot dress, taken at the Ambassador Hotel. Further he had heard the FBI was just finding the witness Keder, in past 2 or 3 days, who was interviewed at some length on TV following the shooting. Ted has some detail on this. Ted Charach [REDACTED] by phone said he was a free lance communications (voice) man who worked with some of the

free lance recorders and photographers including Jeff Brent. He was at the Ambassador in the Embassy room behind the stage during Kenselt and did not witness the actual shooting or see Sirhan. He had been interviewed by the LAPD at the scene. He claimed to have later called the FBI and the Police offering certain observations.

Re films of Sirhan and the girl in the polka dot dress Ted said the films in question had been shot by some of his free lance photographers. He knew of no film showing Sirhan. He had observed at least one girl in a polka dot dress in film shots of the crowd at Kennedy's party 6-4-68. He will remain alert for any one who comes up with film shots of Sirhan.

Immediately after Kenselt, Ted had taken the names of several persons in the crowd who claimed to have seen the shooting. George Green, a negro, Phone # [redacted] and Jim Lowe # [redacted]. Ted in reviewing his notes had the name of Mike Wayne who had a Webster # but full number not obtained. He was not sure just what Mike saw.

Ted talked to one Frank Conte who was known to John Wilman of the L. A. Times about 1/2 hour after the shooting and Conte had claimed he saw a "wild eyed" man running out of the kitchen after the shooting. This statement apparently had no connection as revealing a possible suspect as Ted said it appeared the man running was trying to get to a phone to call an ambulance. Ted did not know if Conte was an eye ball witness or not.

Ted said he had a bumper sticker referring to a J.F. Kennedy conspiracy which was being distributed in the parking lot and around the Ambassador hotel at the Sen. Kennedy party. Mort Goodman, of Mort Goodman Co., a public relations man for the Ambassador Hotel had taken the bumper sticker away from him as he was against the circulation of it. Goodman was in the press room at the time.

Ted said it was hearsay, original source not recalled that Sirhan and some of his buddies had been interviewed on a Joe Pyn TV Show, produced by Mary Gray about a year ago during the middle east war.

Ted had learned from Gabor Kadar, President of Diplomatic Sales, 309 N. Odgen Dr., L. A., 90036 #934-2168, a witness to the Kennedy shooting, the FBI had interviewed him a few days ago.

Action: Kenselt indices revealed Geo. Green and Jim Lowe have been interviewed and leads out on Mike Wayne and Gabor Kadar to SA [redacted] and [redacted] was orally advised of the address of Kadar. No other action recommended.

A review of available records of Central Receiving Hospital failed to indicate any treatment for any person who was injured by a blow of a camera, on 6/5/68.

A further review of Los Angeles report dated 6/9/68, indicated that the person who was struck by a camera was attempting to stop the movement of Senator KENNEDY so that he could photograph the injured KENNEDY. At that point the ambulance attendant, RATLIFF, stated that Mrs. KENNETH pulled the camera away from the photographer and hit him with it. There was no indication that the photographer was in need of medical treatment.

The caller also stated that she was only sorry that JESSE UNRUH had not been killed also and a number of other people whom she failed to specifically name. [REDACTED] advised in her opinion the caller must have been mentally unbalanced and that she, [REDACTED] was furnishing this information to the FBI not as a request that the caller be identified and prosecuted but only for future reference in the event the caller's identity becomes known to her. [REDACTED] If such becomes the case, [REDACTED] stated she would advise.

His relationship with SIRHAN was drinking a cup of coffee with him and being involved in "small conversation" concerning campus activities and things of that nature. He had no recollection of ever hearing SIRHAN discuss his nationalistic tendencies, although he knew he was a Jordanian. SIRHAN did not mention his political views and he can recall nothing that would indicate he was violent in nature or would indicate he was associated with any persons who might advocate violence in any manner. 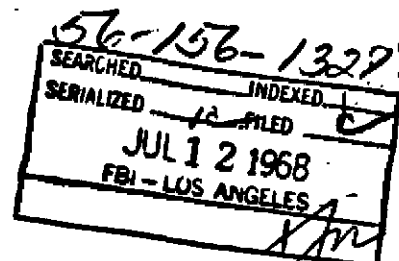

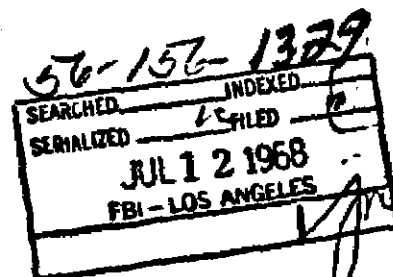

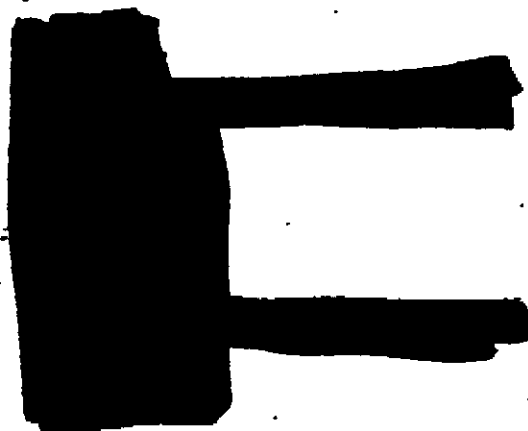

[REDACTED] said that on page 3 of the publication "The Complete Kennedy Saga", copyrighted 1963, published by Special Publications Inc., 6627 Hollywood Blvd., LA 28, California there is a picture of JOHN F. KENNEDY riding in the car in Texas just before he was shot. [REDACTED] says that in this picture, in the upper right corner and in top row of people standing in background is an individual who looks exactly like EARL RAY GALT, the man that killed MARTIN LUTHER KING.

She said that this same picture is in the publication entitled "The Torch is Passed" put out by the Associated Press and is on page 13. This picture is larger than in the other publication.

She said that she had brought this information to the attention of Officer [REDACTED] Intelligence Unit, LAPD, extension 1201 on May 21, 1968. Officer [REDACTED] checked the picture as he had one of the publications at his home. He informed her that he thought that the ears did not appear right. [REDACTED] thought that we should check this and she is almost certain that the man is GALT and that the killingx killing of both KENNEDY's and KING are part of a large conspiracy.

I don't know whether I thanked you or replied to your last dear letter, but if this is the case, it was unintentional, and so now I will thank you twice. I am always very glad when I hear from you and your letters are very dear to me! The day before yesterday I received a letter from Greta Musilova which saddened me very much. Karel is gravely ill, as you know it well yourselves, and there is no hope for his recovery. The doctor gives him one year to live, and this is great suffering, not only for him (he doesn't know it) but also for Greta. She has had more than her share of troubles already. I am very sorry for her and think of her all the

time. Write to her soon, but in such a way that Karel could read it, too. So, I cannot write all about him (what Greta wrote to me). Mirek finished his course of study and now is waiting for a place (employment). He was here all of April when he finished his studies. He came down with his brother-in-law, who was going to Germany on official business, and so he stopped here, too. I was very pleased, because one never knows whether or not we will see each other again. We talked about you all. They announced over the radio this morning that Robert Kennedy was shot - for God's sake, what is going on - and it always happens to the best ones! When you write to me, Paul, tell me about it. As I became old, I became interested in politics and in everything around me. What about your house? Have you sold it yet? Do not hurry; you would miss it and the garden, and I would lose a pleasant memory about the place where I spent a number of nice days.

Is Lilinka well? I wish you both much health for as long as possible. I already feel my years, slowly but surely.

Irena will possibly fly again with Max to the U. S. for her (?) sons (?). She wrote to me to come with Emily to Vienna for three days. We shall see. Poor people, they have it so uncertain again - such is the world - disgusting!

I give my best regards to your children, also to the Goldsneiders - Tony and Flero (?). I think of you and kiss you.

This investigation was predicated upon information from one [REDACTED] Los Angeles, California, to the effect that [REDACTED] had a girlfriend named [REDACTED] who had some information concerning KENSALT. LAM

[REDACTED] steadfastly refused to identify [REDACTED] when he was first contacted June 14, 1968. He would merely state that on the Monday or Tuesday prior to the killing of Kennedy [REDACTED] had been in a phone booth of a downtown Rexall store, had heard a man state, "I didn't make contact with my psychiatrist, but I plan to follow through with my part." She stated that the man making the call somewhat resembled SIRHAN SIRHAN.

Efforts have been made to contact [REDACTED] each day from July 9-12, 1968. On July 15 the writer attempted to contact him at his residence, and then left a message that he should call this office by 9:00 am, 7/16/68. When he did not call he was once again recontacted at which time he stated that neither he nor his wife will divulge the identity of [REDACTED]. His wife refused to talk to the agent and appeared very unhappy that her husband had talked with the FBI. She hinted that evidently [REDACTED] has seen numerous pictures of SIRHAN since the assassination of KENNEDY and that the individual in the phone booth is not identical.

ACTION---In view of the complete lack of cooperation on behalf of the complainant, [REDACTED] since the information is of such a nebulous nature and adds little to the Kensalt case, and since [REDACTED] (Lnu) now indicates that the individual in the booth is not identical with SIRHAN, no further investigation is being conducted regarding this matter.

For your information, the two books requested by Sirhan Sirhan following his arrest and incarceration by Los Angeles authorities have been reviewed at the Bureau. The following is a brief summary of contents and description of authors of these two books:

"The Secret Doctrine (six volumes)
by Madame Helena P. Blavatsky

"Talks on the Path of Occultism, Volume I -
At the Feet of the Master" by Annie Besant
and C. W. Leadbeater.

These books deal with theosophy, a doctrine relating to diety, cosmos and self producing spiritual insight superior to that of historical religion or empirical knowledge by which adherents can master nature and guide their destiny.

The Theosophical Society

In 1873, Madame Blavatsky, born 1831 in Russia, associated with prominent persons in New York investigating the phenomena of spiritualism. In 1875, she founded the Theosophical Society to (1) form a nucleus for the universal brotherhood of humanity, (2) promote study of comparative religion, philosophy and science, and (3) investigate unexplained laws of nature and the powers latent in man. Organization's headquarters were established in India. By 1891, the year of her death, Madame Blavatsky had nearly 100,000 followers throughout the world.

Annie Besant, born 1847 in London and a devoted pupil of Madame Blavatsky, became president of the Society in 1907. In 1909, she and her associate, Charles W. Leadbeater, selected a 14-year-old Hindu boy, Krishnamurti, to be the new world teacher and Messiah of the movement. However, the boy did not measure up to her expectations and renounced practically all her writings. She died in the 1930's.

In recent years, the Theosophical Society has maintained its U.S. headquarters and publishing house for Society literature at Wheaton, Illinois. Current aims are to build idea of brotherhood of man without regard to color, sex, or religion and to further study of all philosophies and religions.

"The Secret Doctrine"

This six-volume book, completed in 1888, is a synthesis of science, religion and philosophy. Its purpose is to (1) show that nature is not "a fortuitous concurrence of atoms, (2) assign to man his rightful place in the scheme of the universe, (3) rescue from degradation the archaic truths which are basis of all religions, and (4) show that occult side of nature has never been approached by the science of modern civilization.

Volumes 1 and 2 deal with cosmogenesis, the theory of the origin and development of the universe. Volumes 3 and 4 relate to anthropogenesis, the study of biological origin and development of man involving man's impact on nature. Volume 5 is largely miscellaneous, comprised of papers of Madame Blavatsky on random subjects such as origin of magic, ancient religious dogmas, various occult systems, Hebrew allegories, symbolism of sun and stars, mystery of Buddha, et cetera. Volume 6 is an index and glossary.

"Talks on the Path of Occultism"

According to the book (published in 1926), the four qualifications for pursuing the path of occultism (belief in hidden or mysterious powers and the possibility of subjecting them to human control) are: discrimination, desirelessness, good conduct and love. By discrimination, the authors mean knowledge of what is worth following and what is not worth following. By desirelessness, the authors refer to learning to do right for right's sake, not for the sake of anything man may gain from it for himself. By good conduct is meant self-control of mind and action, tolerance, cheerfulness and confidence. By love is meant man must be careful not to hurt any living thing and always watch for an opportunity to help

others. (Significantly, from Sirhan's standpoint, the book states "Intentional cruelty is purposely to give pain to another living being; and that is the greatest of all sins--the work of a devil rather than a man.")

It is noted these two books contain no mystical theories concerning assassination, acts of violence, et cetera. On the contrary, the theosophical concept is based on brotherhood of man.

She was present at Senator KENNEDY's victory celebration on the night of June 4, 1968, at the Ambassador Hotel. She heard about four pops in quick succession shortly after Senator KENNEDY left the Embassy Room; but she did not realize at the time that they were shots. She was at the Ambassador Hotel from around 8:00 PM on June 4, 1968, until the time of the shooting, but at no time did she see the man who has been identified as SIRHAN SIRHAN.

On June 9, 1968, [REDACTED] the Desk Clerk at the Hope Hotel, told her that a man by the name of JOHN WRIGHT had said that he was a witness to the shooting and that he knew something about it. She told [REDACTED] that she would like to talk to WRIGHT; and [REDACTED] called WRIGHT at the Milner Hotel and had him come to the Hope Hotel. Throughout the course of the afternoon and evening, WRIGHT told PETTINATO the following story:

He was employed as a "kitchen reporter" at the Ambassador Hotel; and he was on duty from 10:00 PM on June 4, 1968, to 8:00 AM on June 5, 1968. He first noticed the man identified in the newspaper as SIRHAN SIRHAN at about 11:00 PM on June 4, 1968. SIRHAN came into the kitchen at that time, and he hung around in there drinking coffee. He noticed SIRHAN because he was dressed differently from the kitchen employees. He saw somebody shake KENNEDY's hand in the kitchen. He saw SIRHAN facing KENNEDY and pointing the gun at him; and he saw KENNEDY fall, but he was watching SIRHAN and he never saw SIRHAN pull the trigger of the gun. WRIGHT observed this from the main kitchen by the refrigerator, and he saw SIRHAN standing directly behind the steam table.

TURNER interviewed on 6/25/68 and stated that he was in a room at the Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles on 6/4/68 with other members of the press awaiting the arrival of Senator KENNEDY. Senator KENNEDY was supposed to come to the press room after he had addressed a group of his supporters. TURNER and the other members of the press were observing KENNEDY on closed-circuit TV.

TURNER said he was covering the MAX RAFFERTY senatorial campaign and had gone over to Senator KENNEDY's press room while things were slow in RAFFERTY's press headquarters. After arriving in KENNEDY's press room, DICK DRAYNE, KENNEDY's press representative, told the group that KENNEDY would be coming to the press room. DRAYNE explained to them that there was such a large crowd in the other room that it would be best if KENNEDY came to them. TURNER said he was not aware of the names of the rooms at the Ambassador Hotel.

As they were observing KENNEDY leave the room by way of TV after addressing his supporters, TURNER said he heard three shots which sounded like the pop of firecrackers. He ran down the corridor and observed a struggle involving RAFER JOHNSON and ROOSEVELT GREEK with a young man, whom he now knows to be SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. Several other people were struggling with

SIRHAN and holding him down. TURNER said he continued on down the hall and obtained an open line on a telephone to his New York office which, with the help of WARREN WEAVER, also of the Times, they were able to keep open.

He went back down the hall where Senator KENNEDY lay and still observed SIRHAN being restrained on a table. He also observed the Los Angeles Police Department officers arrive and saw SIRHAN being led off. GREER was restraining bystanders from hurting SIRHAN.

TURNER said he had never seen SIRHAN before this time. He said he was a personal friend of Senator KENNEDY and ~~for this~~ reason was not covering his campaign. He identified LISA BRCO, age 18, of Crawford High School, San Diego, and KARL DECKER, of the hotel staff, as two eye witnesses who saw SIRHAN shoot Senator KENNEDY. He said both of these individuals have testified before the Grand Jury in Los Angeles.

GERALD ROBERT AMSTER, [REDACTED] was interviewed at his residence. He voluntarily furnished the following information:

He advised that [REDACTED] address is the residence of his parents, [REDACTED]. His parents are currently away for two weeks on vacation and he is occupying the apartment. He returned to New York from California on June 29, 1968 and is presently seeking employment.

With regard to the assassination of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, AMSTER advised that he was present in the ballroom of the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, when the assassination took place. He stated that evening, June 4, 1968, he drove to the Ambassador Hotel at approximately 11:00 pm in a car he was using at the time, a 1968 white Ford, rented from Budget Rent-A-Car, 6935 Hollywood Boulevard, Hollywood, California. He advised that he is not particularly a follower of ROBERT F. KENNEDY and if, anything, leans toward Senator EUGENE MC CARTHY; however, he advised he was curious and interested in viewing the activities at the KENNEDY Headquarters that evening.

AMSTER stated he had no difficulty whatsoever in entering any of the ballrooms and no one stopped him or asked for any identification. He stated, in fact, he spent approximately one hour in the teletype room adjoining the ballroom where he watched incoming reports on the voting in the primary.

When Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY made his victory speech in the early morning of June 5, 1968, AMSTER said he was in the auditorium approximately four or five rows back from the rostrum and to the left of the rostrum. He saw KENNEDY turn and leave toward the kitchen at the end of his speech and he (AMSTER) turned in the opposite

direction and started towards the rear of the ballroom. He heard the shots and advised that there was screaming and much confusion. He stated that approximately 15 minutes after the shooting he saw the police removing the alleged attacker from the hotel. He believes he was positioned at the time in the second floor lobby. He stayed at the Ambassador Hotel until approximately 8:00 am to listen to news of the condition of Senator KENNEDY.

At approximately 3:00 am, June 5, 1968, AMSTER advised that he made several telephone calls from the hotel using one of the telephones in the press room. He stated the phone was connected for direct distance dialing and he recalls making three calls as follows:

AMSTER stated that while he was at the Ambassador Hotel he was by himself and made no acquaintances there. He neither arrived nor left with anyone. He did not see SIRHAN B. SIRHAN at any time before the shooting took place.

AMSTER stated that there was one incident which he felt should be brought to the attention of the authorities which may have some bearing on the case. In connection with this he related the following:

On May 25, 1968, he was at a bar on Santa Monica Boulevard, Los Angeles, called The Pub when he struck up a conversation with an individual he determined to be Mexican. He stated the conversation came about inasmuch as he (AMSTER) speaks Spanish and the individual seemed anxious to speak to someone in his native tongue. This individual whose name he did not learn was apparently very dissatisfied and unhappy in Los Angeles. He told AMSTER of his desire to return to Mexico. In view of the friendly tone of their conversation the individual invited AMSTER to a private party which was to be held the following night, May 26, 1968, at the "Fiesta Time at the Tropics," 13539 Ventura Boulevard. The individual stated there will be many latin and other foreign individuals in attendance and that these parties are held every Sunday. He gave AMSTER a card which he stated would have to be presented at the door in order to gain admittance. He stated that if AMSTER had any difficulty whatsoever in getting in, he was to mention the name SIRHAN B. SIRHAN. AMSTER said that, of course, at the time he had never heard this name and he asked the individual to spell it for him. AMSTER wrote the name on the back of the card and furnished this card to the interviewing agents.

He advised that to the best of his recollection he was not to meet SIRHAN but to merely mention the name to anyone at the door. AMSTER advised he was unable to furnish any additional information regarding the party inasmuch as he did not attend. He stated he kept the card since he felt that he might some day attend one of the parties inasmuch as they were held weekly. He is also unable to furnish any additional identifying information regarding the individual who gave him the card.

While in California, AMSTER frequented two bars which were also frequented by the Arab element along with other foreign element. These were Turk A La Bab, Hollywood Boulevard and the Seventh Veil on Sunset Boulevard, in Hollywood. He stated he did not belong to any organizations or have any other friends or associates other than those already mentioned.

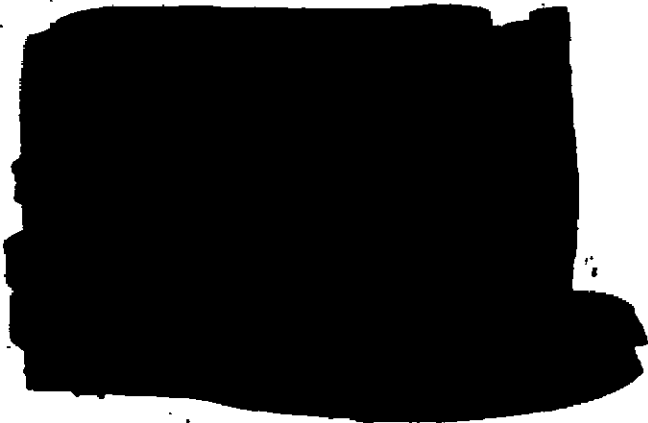

The above captioned subject came to the attention of the FBI Office at Los Angeles when he appeared at the office during the evening hours of 5/23/68. Subject at this time was given the name of the writer by mistake. Subject has appeared at the FBI Office on many occasions, however, the writer has never met or talked with this individual in person. On each visit to the office subject always left some type of material of no value. On 5/29/68, the subject was located through investigation by the writer and contacted concerning the items he had left at the FBI office. During the telephone conversation the subject stated he desired to work for the FBI as an undercover Agent. During this conversation he stated that he had been doing work for the CIA for five years and that no one would listen to him. He further stated that SENATOR KENNEDY would be in Los Angeles campaigning and that he "did not want to have another Dallas incident". The writer asked the subject if he was making any type of threat and the subject stated he was not making any threats. In the early morning hours of 6/5/68 when Senator KENNEDY was shot, the subject appeared at the Los Angeles Office dressed in a flight suit and became very boisterous, at which time he was subdued by Agents who contacted the LAPD to have the subject taken away. Subject was arrested by the Venice Division, LAPD, on 6/7/68, when he made statements to the effect that he had intended to blow up the plane carrying the body of Senator KENNEDY back to New York.

[REDACTED] VA Hospital, Sepulveda, California, advised her records reflect subject arrested while in Ojai, California, and taken to Camarillo State Hospital where he made statement that he was assigned the task of killing the person who killed Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. [REDACTED] he was presently at the VA Hospital, Sepulveda, however, she was calling to determine if subject wanted by the FBI.



He stated that he was currently in Los Angeles at the Hall of Justice Building in connection with a trial and desired to know if the Los Angeles Office had any other questions to ask him prior to his departure to New York on the evening of 7/17/68. He advised he would recontact the Los Angeles Office by telephone for a reply.

AMSTER contacted the office approximately 15 minutes later and was advised that there were no further questions which we desired at this time. He stated that he was still residing at the address where he was interviewed in New York. AMSTER stated that he had attempted to cooperate to the fullest extent with the FBI in this matter and desired to know how the FBI had learned that he was at the Ambassador Hotel on the evening of the shooting. He was advised that this information could not be made available and, further, that the writer was not aware of how his name was obtained as being at the Ballroom.



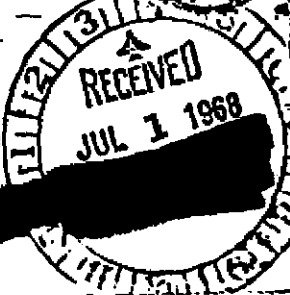
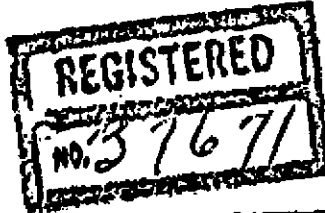

On July 8, 1968, an unknown white male personally contacted the Portland, Maine, Resident Agency. He refused to identify himself and stated he was on vacation and his home was in California. He repeatedly declined to furnish his name.

He stated that he was a visitor and observer at the United States Senate Visitors Gallery on May 23, 1968. While there, he noticed an usher tell two men to move, as they were sitting in a reserved section of the gallery. The two men then stood alongside two women; and, although the speaker was Senator WONG of Hawaii, they concentrated on some other individual on the Senate floor. The complainant continued that he saw the brother of SIRHAN (the accused killer of Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY) on television recently and realized that the two men he saw in the United States Senate Gallery were SIRHAN and his brother. He was fairly positive of this.

The unknown complainant could furnish no additional pertinent information.

While they were in the dining room, a waiter said ROBERT KENNEDY had been shot in the head. The waiter said he heard this information over the Arabic radio. The waiter commented that the trouble with the world is the "Jew" and the U. S. is dominated and motivated by Zionists.

Mr. SWEDE is unable to explain why the waiter made comment regarding the shooting of Senator KENNEDY about three weeks before he was actually shot. He felt the information was important enough that it be brought to the attention of someone, and he notified the American Embassy in Singapore, shortly after the actual shooting of KENNEDY.
